ABOUT THE BLUE ANGELS: This will be the first-ever men's basketball game for the one-time all girls school. Just two non-freshmen are on coach Danny Nigro's roster. Junior Jack Tisdale was a walk-on at Palm Beach Atlantic, where he played in 23 games, averaging 4.7 minutes per game. Tisdale also played 17 games for Polk State, a Florida junior college, last season. Nobody else on the CNR roster has ever laced them up at the collegiate level. Coach Nigro comes to CNR from Division I St. Francis (NY), where he was an assistant the last three seasons. Prior to St. Francis, Nigro was the head coach at the Borough of Manhattan Community College and also led the Polytechnic Institute of NYU program from 2007-2009. At BMCC, Nigro led the 2009-10 squad to a regular season title and advanced to the CUNYAC championships. Nigro has also had success at the high school level. From 2004-2006 he guided the Berkeley Carroll School to two New York State Tournament appearances and also coached Midwood High School to a PSAL Division Title in 2002.

ABOUT THE KNIGHTS: The Knights graduated just two seniors and return their top four scorers from last season's 17-9 team, led by 6-5 senior guard Justin Ringen, who averaged 21.7 points per game and his classmate, 6-1 guard John Decker, who averaged 18.8 points per game. Both like to shoot the three. Ringen knocked down 89 treys last season, connecting at a 44.9 percent clip. Decker, who shot 38.3 percent from the arc, hit 59 treys a year ago. Ringen and Decker also earned All-SUNYAC honors last season. As a team, the Knights shot 40.7 percent from three-point range. Geneseo coach Steve Minton is entering his 17th season as the Knights head coach. Minton is 247-178 at Geneseo. The former Miami (Oh.) assistant also spent four seasons as head coach at Hiram college.

ABOUT THE LIONS: Junior guard Eric Murdock, Jr. , a preseason Division 3 All-America pick, leads the Lions, who were 16-12 a year ago and advanced to the NJAC final. Murdock was TCNJ's leading scorer last season, averaging 19.1 points per game while shooting 45 percent from the field. Murdoch also led the conference in assists with 180 (6.4 per game) and minutes played per game (36.0), while knocking down 41 percent of his third-point field goal attempts (third in the NJAC). The 180 assists distributed by Murdock, Jr. set a TCNJ program record. This will be TCNJ coach Matt Goldsmith's second season at the helm. Prior to taking over at TCNJ, Goldsmith was a part of two Division 3 National Championship teams at Amherst, one as a player (2007) and one as an assistant coach (2013) The Lions averaged They averaged 75.7 points per game and led the NJAC in three-point shooting, averaging 9.6 treys per game.

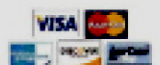

Pennsylvania Auto Theft Prevention Authority

Created in 1994, The Pennsylvania Auto Theft Prevention Authority (ATPA) funds a statewide grantee network of more than 100 highly skilled police officers, state troopers, detectives, prosecutors, paralegals, and support staff — all dedicated to the the reduction and prevention of auto theft. As an independent agency, the ATPA does not use tax dollars; it's funded through an annual assessment of insurance companies. For every dollar invested, there has been a nearly seven dollar return on investment in reduced auto theft rates and recovered stolen vehicles/parts.

Since inception, the ATPA has contributed to a 73% decrease in the rate of motor vehicle theft in Pennsylvania, compared to a national decrease of 53%.
